Our readers now have access to **ACCURIS Engineering Workbench (EWB)**, a modern platform that brings together technical standards from around the world into one comprehensive system. It offers data from more than 400 international and national publishers, including ASME, SAE, ANSI, IEEE, IEC, ISO, EN, DIN, and BSI.

Thanks to advanced AI-powered search, you can easily find out whether a standard is current, what revisions have been published, which documents are related to it, and what the standard contains. EWB greatly simplifies navigation through technical standards and speeds up the work of engineers and companies.

Full-text access within the NTK subscription includes technical standards for the automotive industry: **GMW – General Motors Worldwide** and **GMNA – General Motors North America** for the metals segment, metal material specifications, and testing.
